Go and Come Back




The Boomerang Action (行って戻る)

Not just 'Coming', but Returning!



'Kimasu' means 'Come'. But '～Te-kimasu' implies a **round trip**. It is the standard phrase for 'I'll be back'.

Te-form + Kimasu




Connect the action with Kimasu. It implies: Go, Do, and Return.




Result: Katte kimasu (Buy and come back)

コンビニで水を買ってきます。



(I'll go buy water at the convenience store and come back.)

Raya's Hack



Motte Kuru
= Bring!

Motte (Hold) + Kuru (Come)

Just like “Motte Iku” (Take),
“Motte Kuru” is super
common.

Example: “Motte kite!” (Bring it
here!)


Don't do this!



✗ **Itte ikimasu (Go and Go?)** -> Sounds like leaving forever.

✓ **Itte kimasu (Go and Come Back)** -> The standard 'I'm leaving' greeting.
