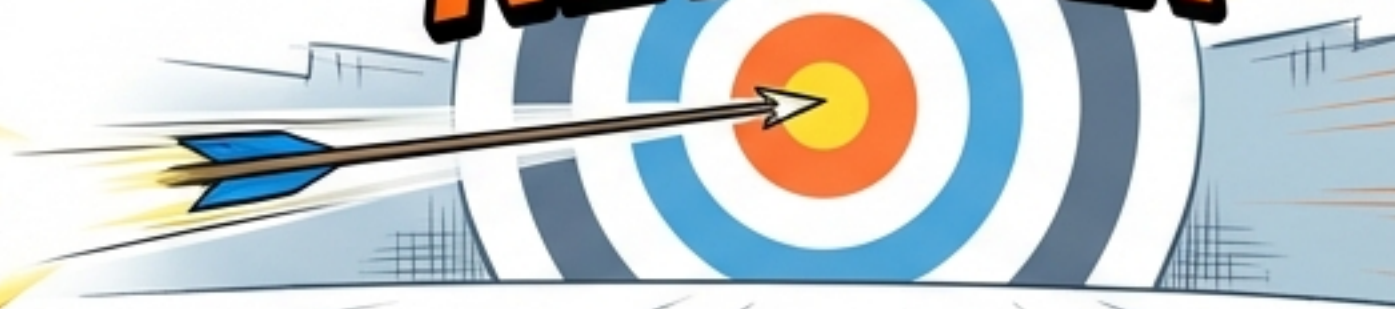


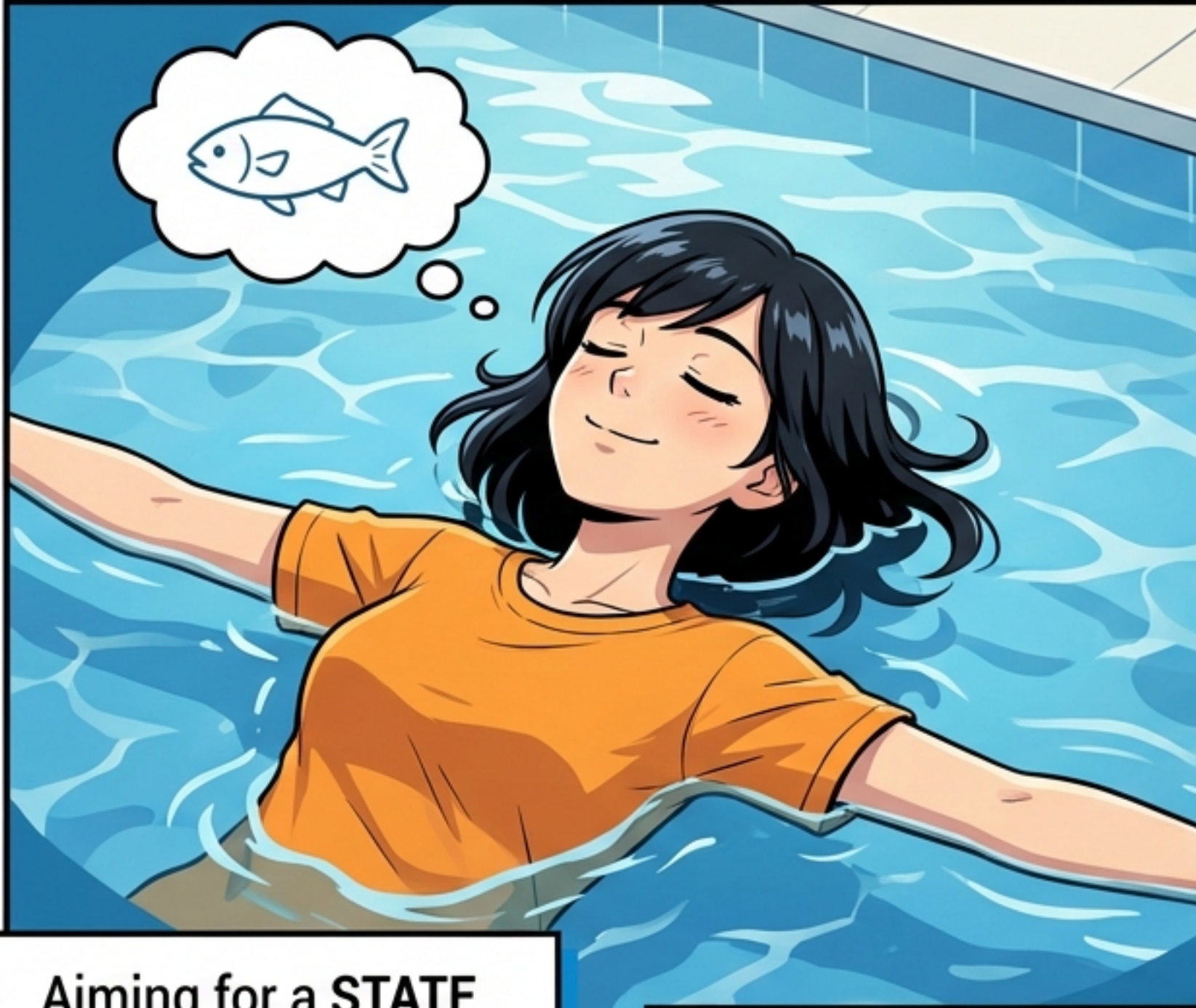

The "Purpose" Showdown



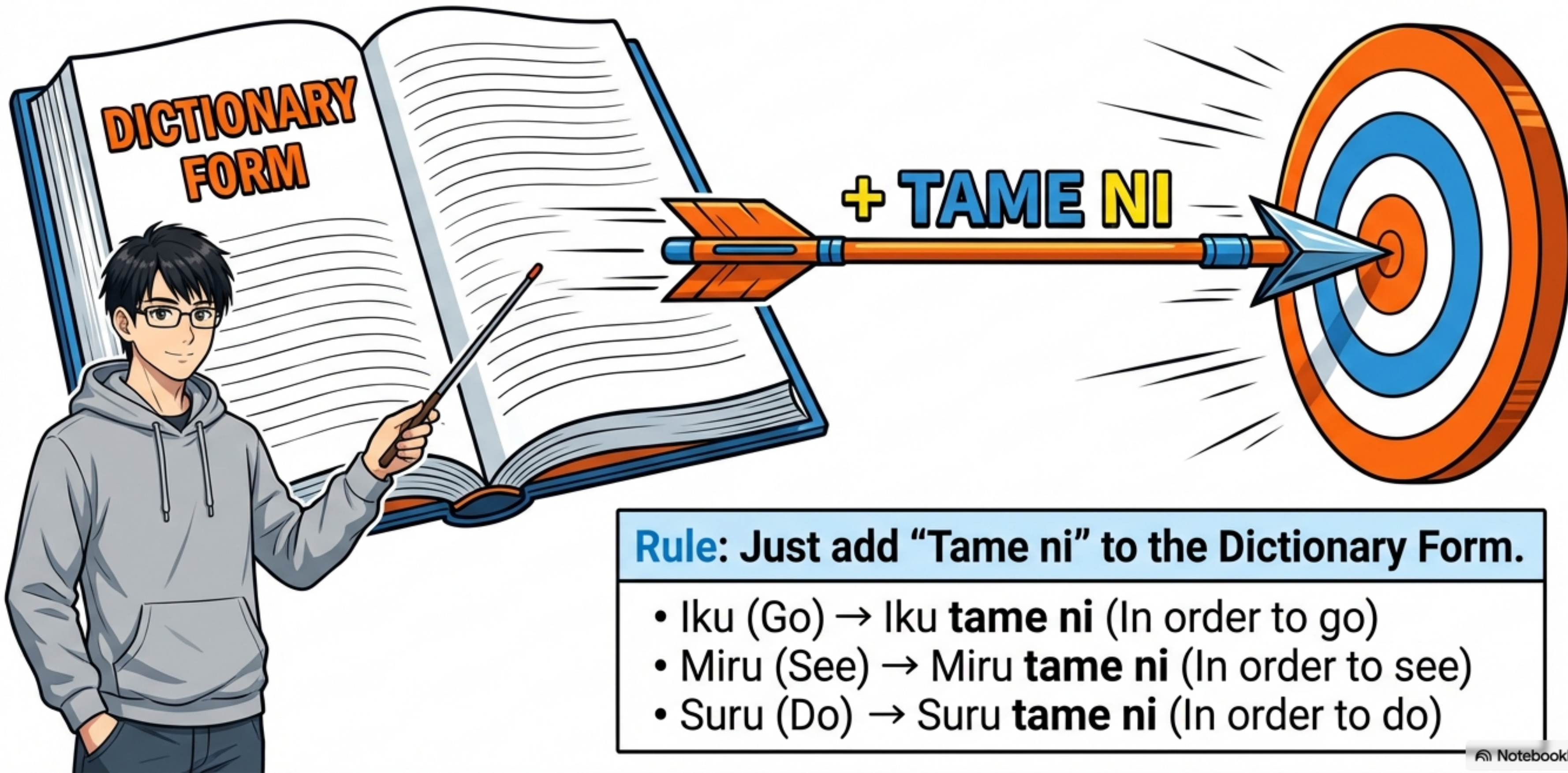
Aiming for a **STATE**
So that I can... (YOUNI ように)



Aiming for an **ACTION**
In order to... (TAME NI ために)

YOUNI = Potential/State (To be able to X)
TAME NI = Will/Volition (Do A to get B)

The “Dictionary” Connection



Rule: Just add “Tame ni” to the Dictionary Form.

- Iku (Go) → Iku **tame ni** (In order to go)
- Miru (See) → Miru **tame ni** (In order to see)
- Suru (Do) → Suru **tame ni** (In order to do)

Sentence Assembly



日本へ 行く ために、働きます。

(Nihon e iku tame ni, hatarakimasu.)
I work in order to go to Japan.

Raya's Hack: Noun Power



Nouns need ownership! Use the particle NO.

- *Kazoku no tame ni* (For the sake of my family)
- *Kenkou no tame ni* (For health)

Don't do this! ⚠



Mistake: ✗ 忘れない ために (Wasurenai tame ni)

Why? "Not forgetting" is a State, not an Action.

Correction: Use YOUNI for negative/potential goals.

✓ Wasurenai youni (So I won't forget)

Master Guide: ～ために



1. **Direct Aim:** Use for conscious, active goals.
2. **Verb Structure:** [Dictionary Form] + **tame ni**
3. **Noun Structure:** [Noun] + **no** + **tame ni**

4. WARNING: Do **NOT** use with **Negatives (nai)** or **Potential verbs (eru/areru)**. (Use **Youni** for these!)
