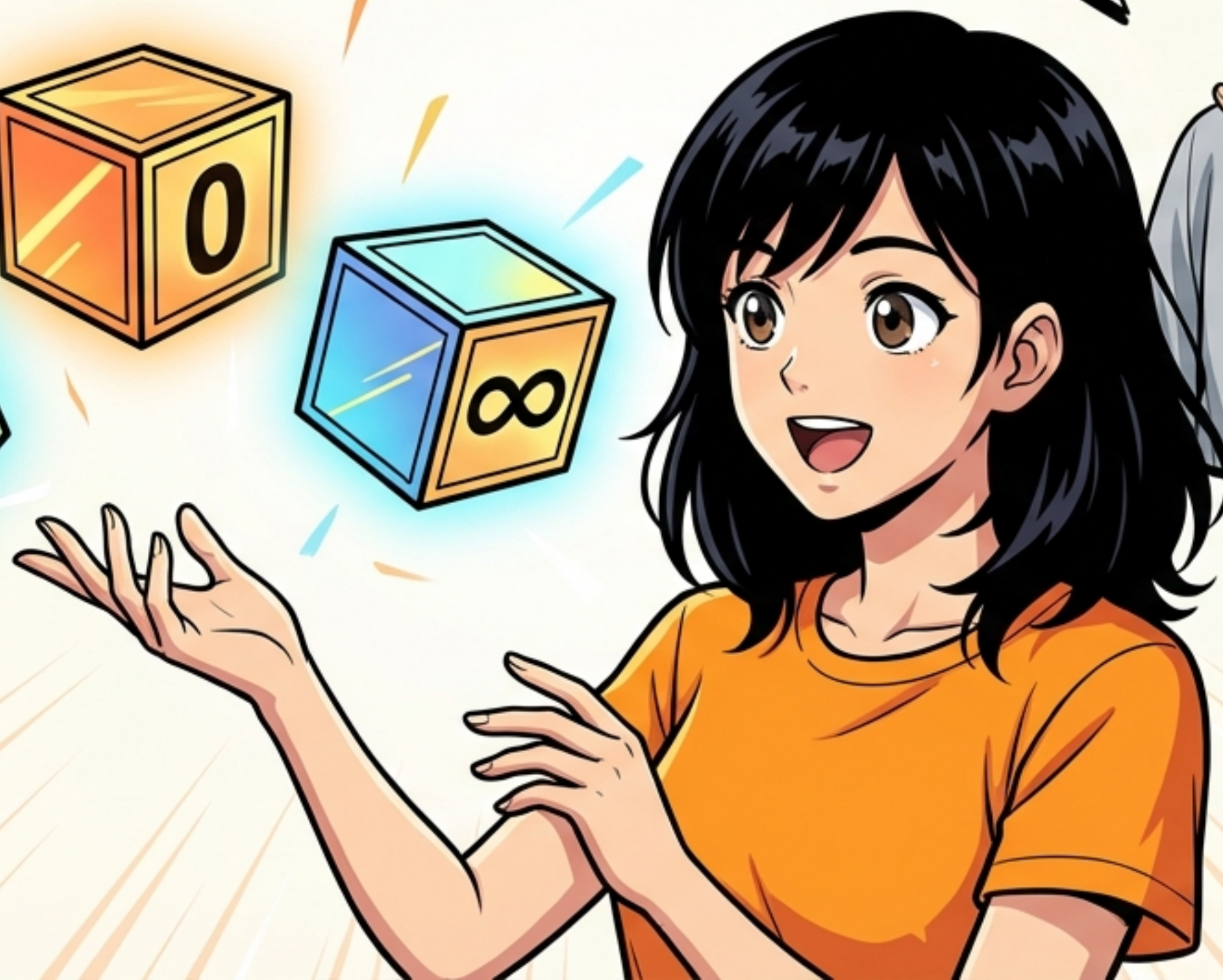

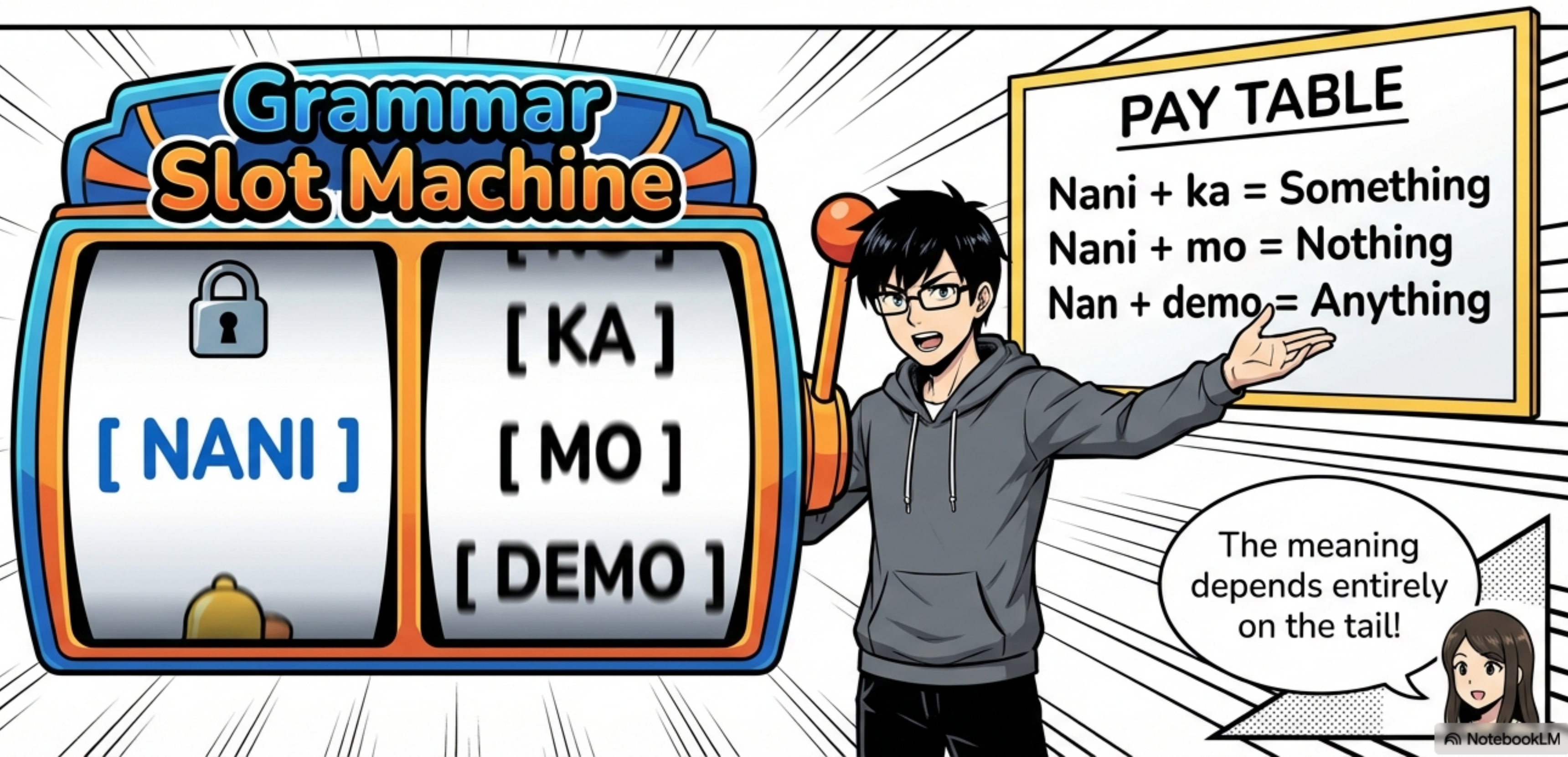
The Mystery Boxes: Some, No, Any



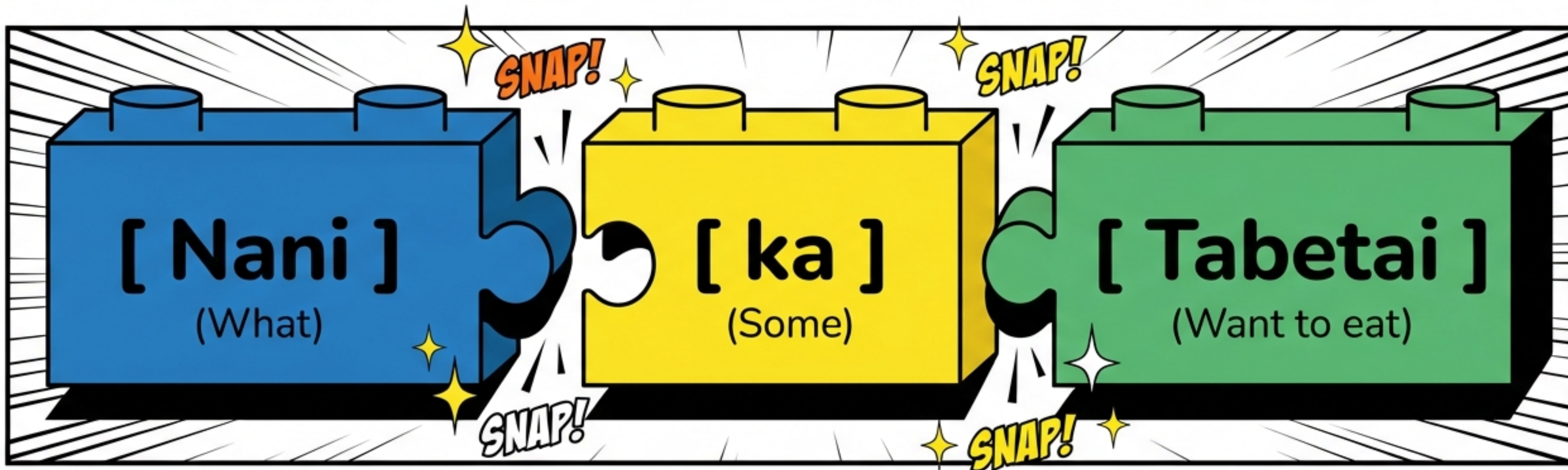


Ken's Note: Adding a particle changes the question word into a noun.

Spin the Particle!



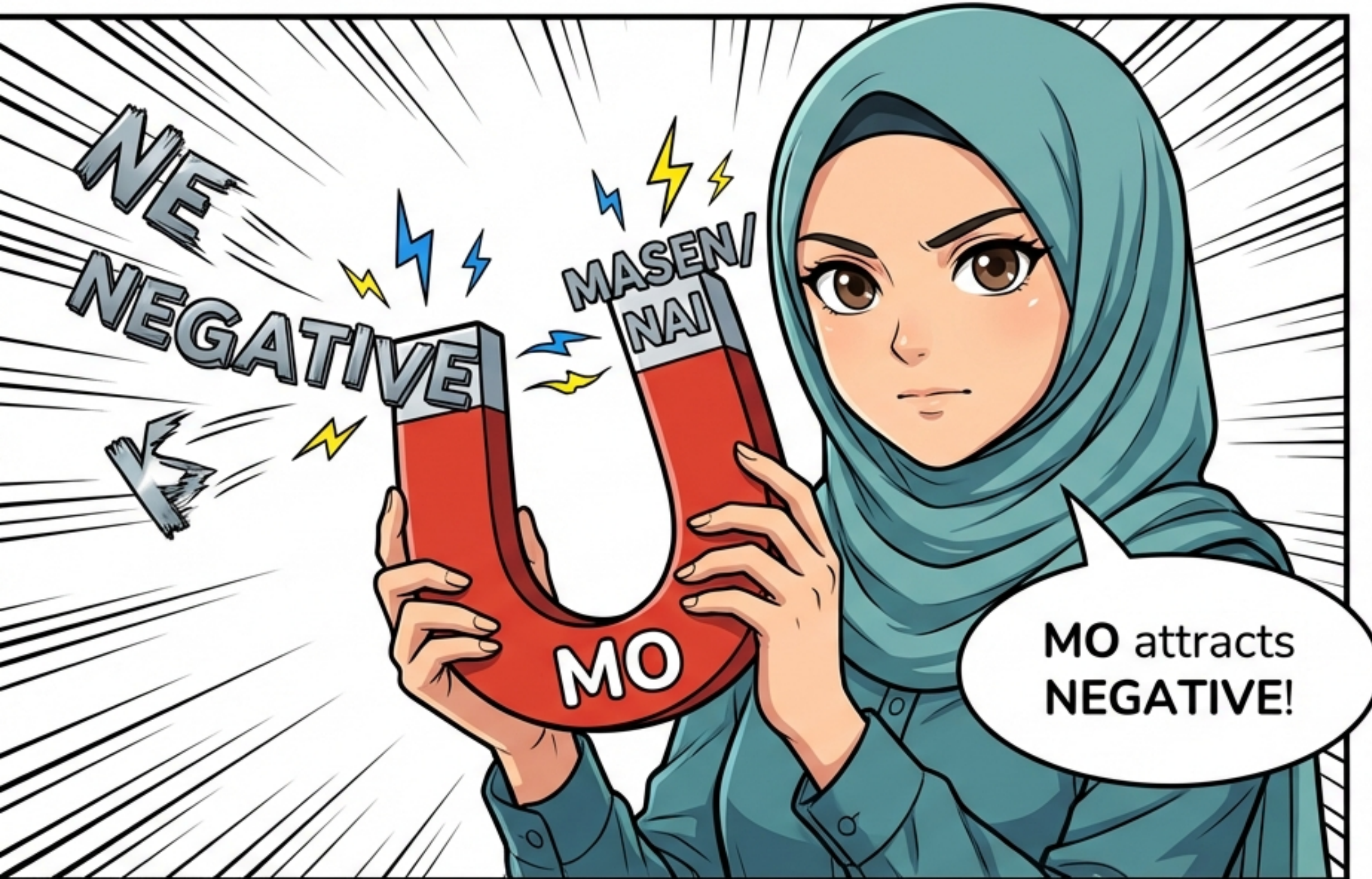
Construction Time

“Raya’s Hack”

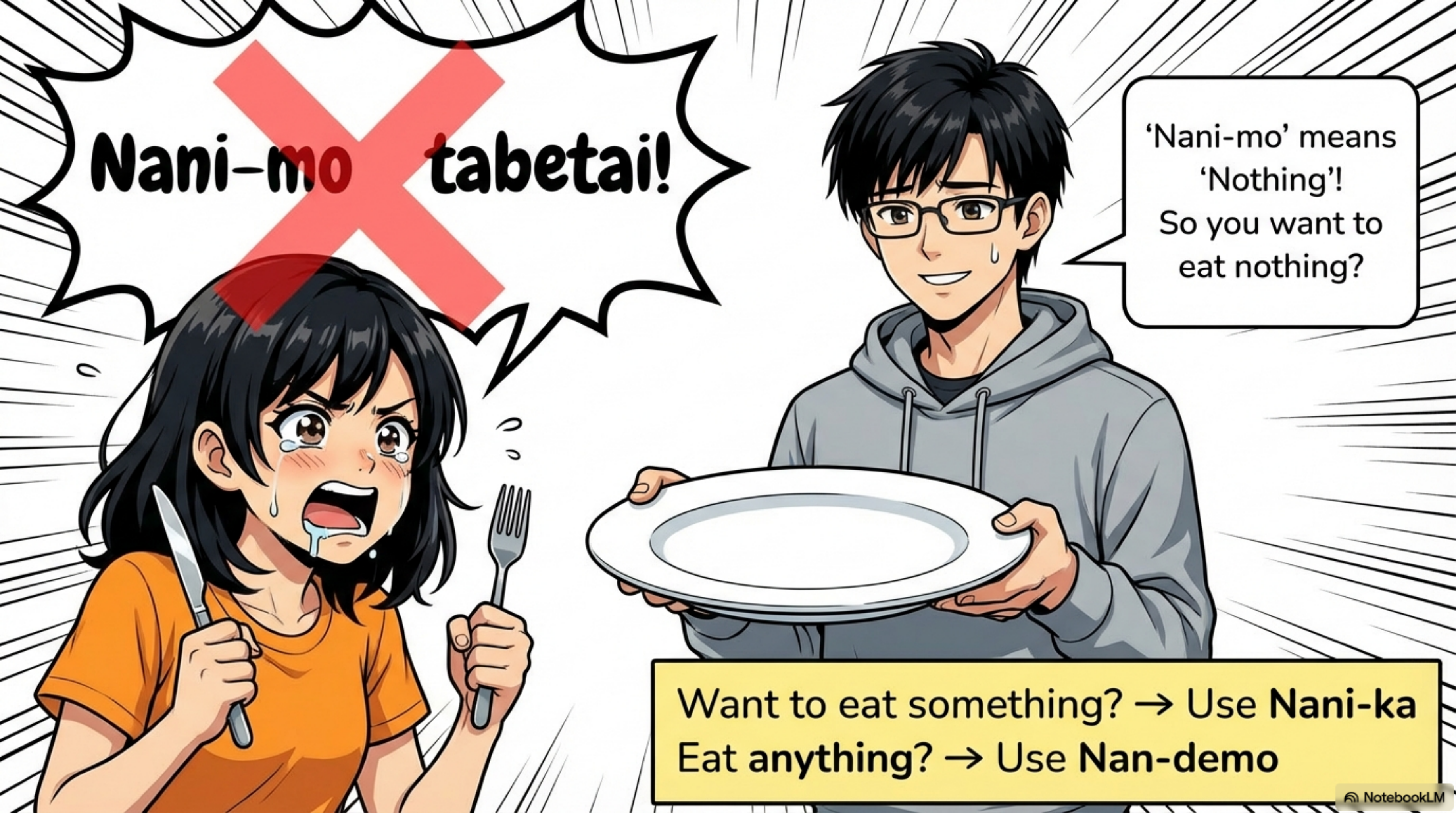


Mo + Masen / Nai

Wrong: Dare-mo imasu.

Correct: Dare-mo imasen
(No one is there).

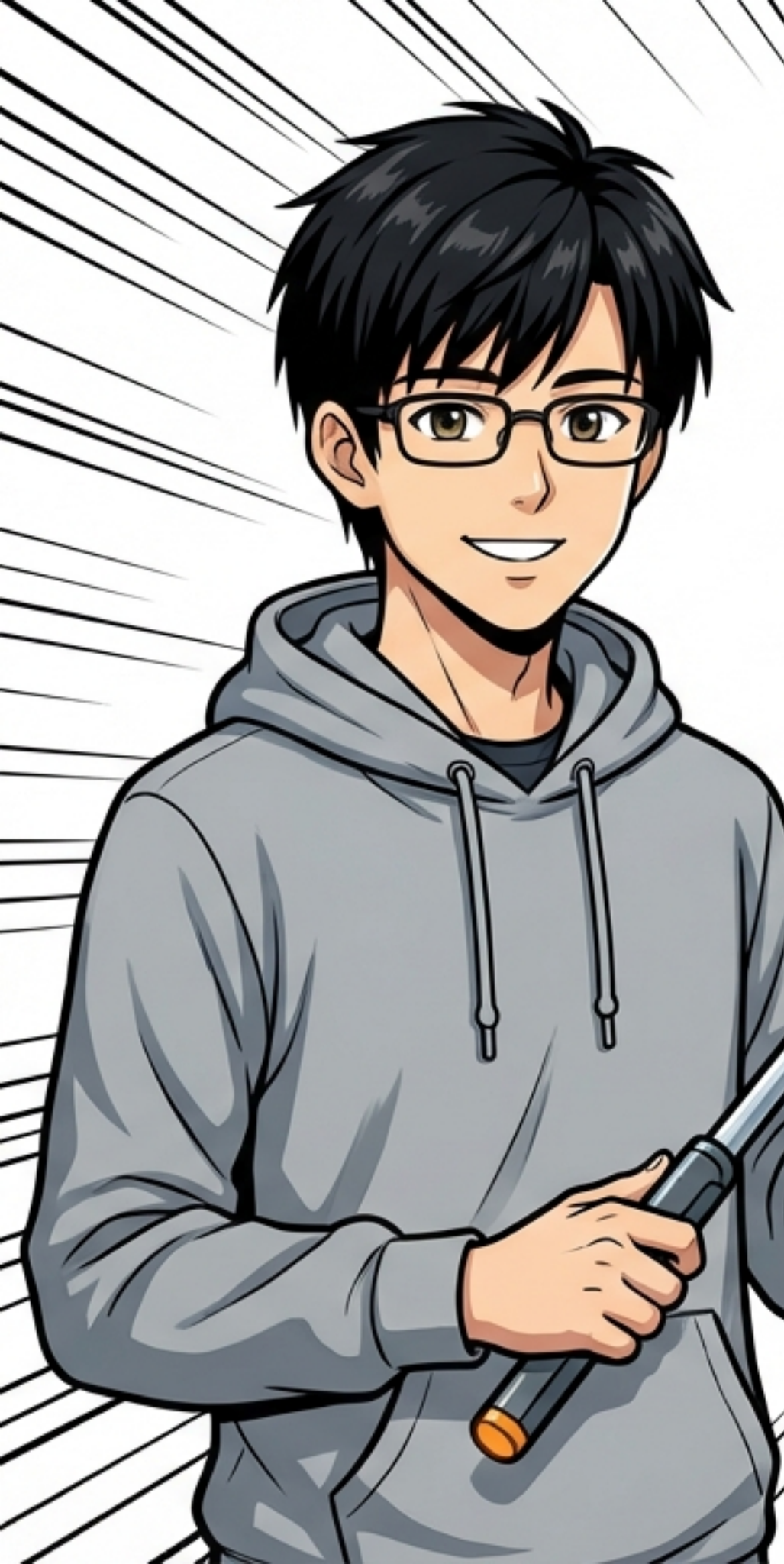
Exception:
“Itsu-mo”
(Always)
is positive!



Nani-mo tabetai!

'Nani-mo' means
'Nothing'!
So you want to
eat nothing?

Want to eat something? → Use **Nani-ka**
Eat anything? → Use **Nan-demo**



Bangers

JAPANESE GRAMMAR CHEAT SHEET

- ~KA (Some)

- Dare-ka (Someone)
- Nani-ka (Something)
- Doko-ka (Somewhere)

- ~MO (No) *[Must use Negative Verb]*

- Dare-mo (No one)
- Nani-mo (Nothing)
- Doko-mo (Nowhere)

- ~DEMO (Any)

- Dare-demo (Anyone)
- Nan-demo (Anything)
- Doko-demo (Anywhere)

Exception: Itsu-mo (Always) = Positive!
