Planning a Negative Outcome

Doing an action

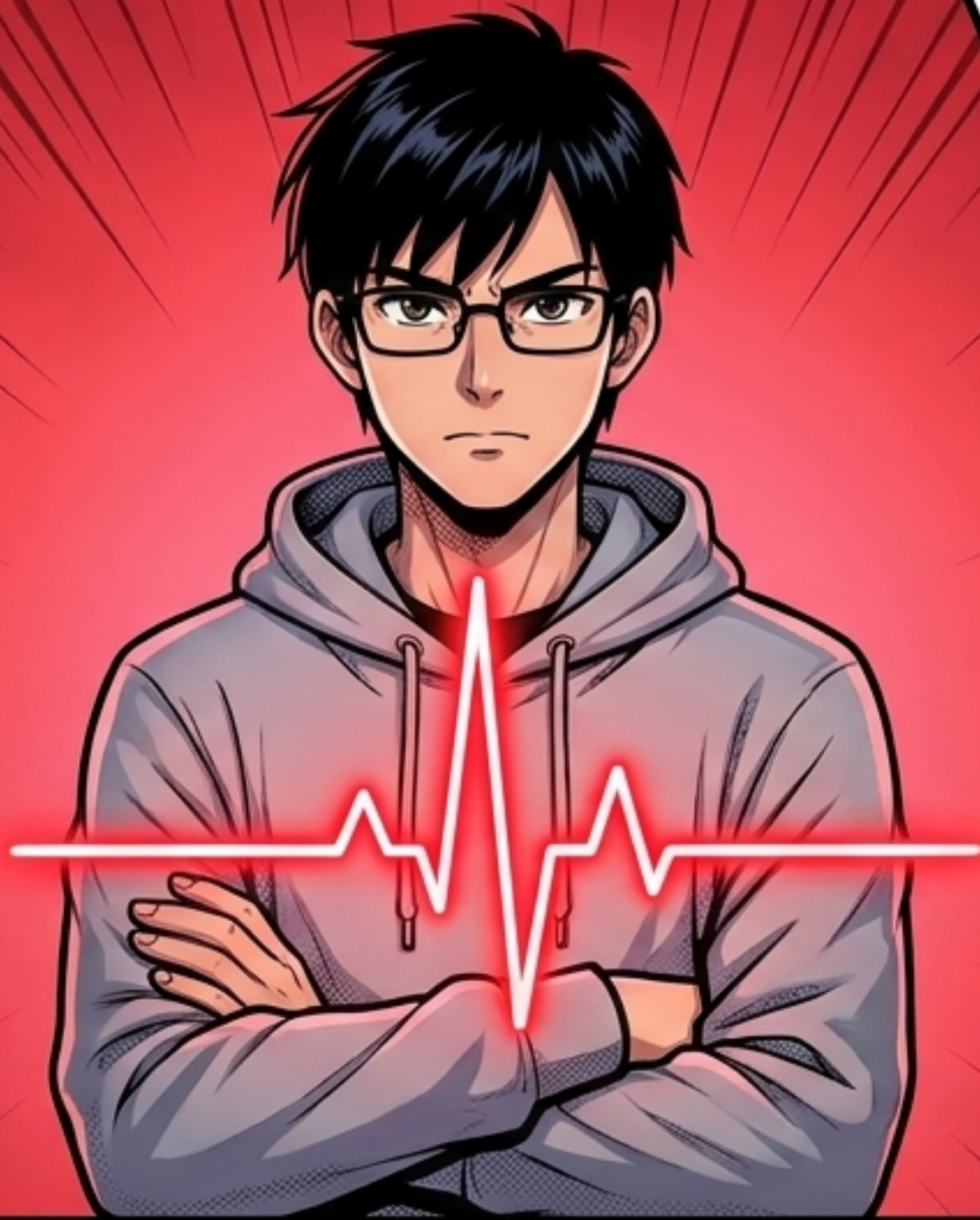


I plan NOT to go out.
I plan NOT to buy a game.



Deciding on an Absence:
“Nai-form + Tsumori desu” shows that you have consciously decided to avoid an action.

Nai-form + つもりです



Active Decision (The 'Nai-Form' Shield)



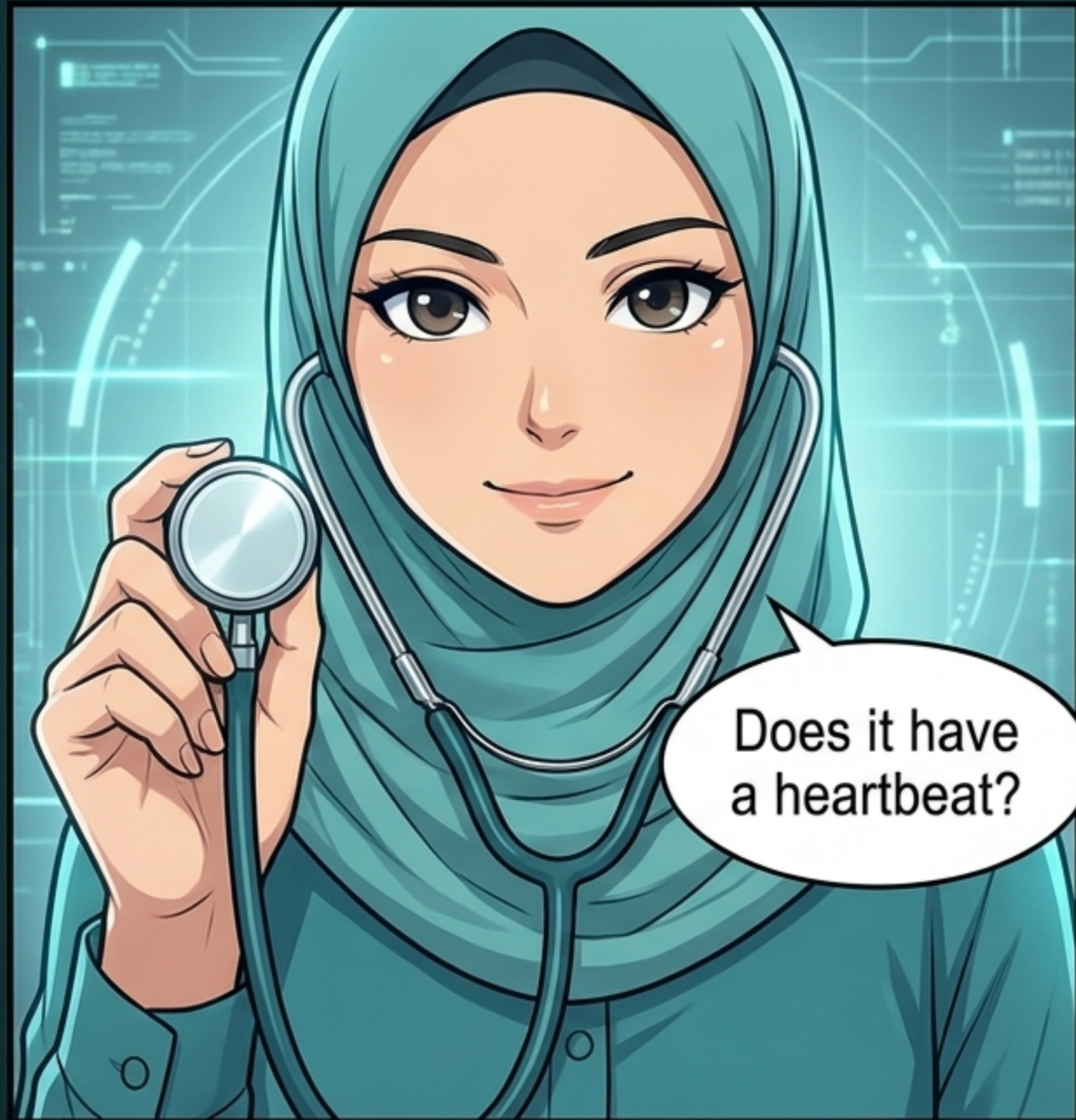
Passive Nothingness

Iku → Ika-nai → Ikanai tsumori desu. (You are taking an active stance to NOT do it).

The Assembly Line



Raya's Hack: The Stronger 'No'



Does it have
a heartbeat?

V-nai tsumori desu
= I plan not to...
(A living intention)

V-dict tsumori wa arimasen
= I have no intention to...
(0% Chance / The intention does
not exist!)

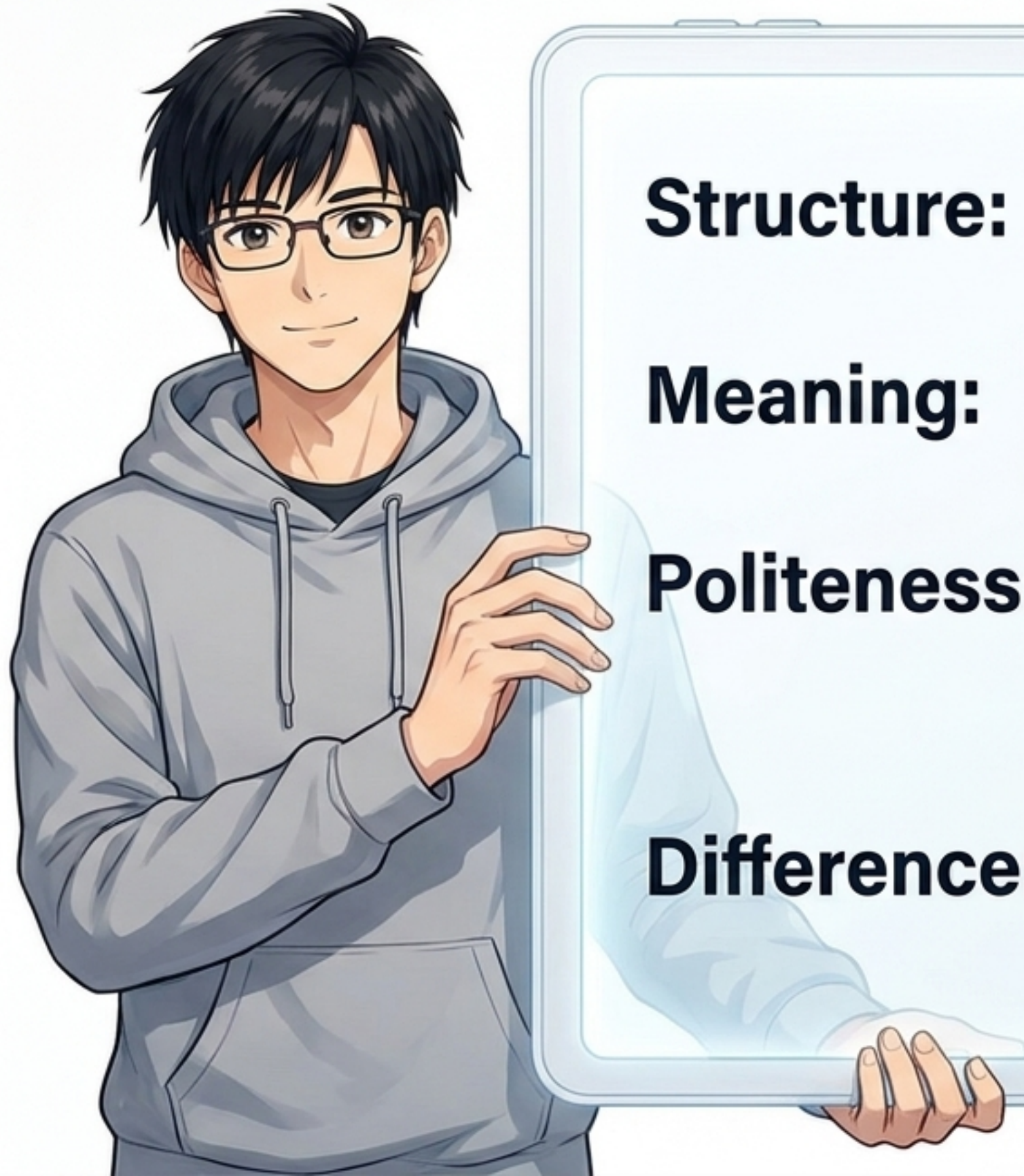
DON'T DO THIS! (✗ Deciding for Others)

「ケンさんは
かわない
つもりです!」

(Ken-san intends
not to buy it!)

**You can't use 'Tsumori' to state someone else's negative intentions.
It sounds like you are judging them or controlling their mind!
Use Yotei or Rashii for others.**

The Cheat Sheet



Structure: [Verb Nai-form] + つもりです。

Meaning: I plan not to... / I intend not to...

Politeness: Only use for your own intentions.

Difference: Use it for firm decisions, not just vague wishes.
