Inside your head.



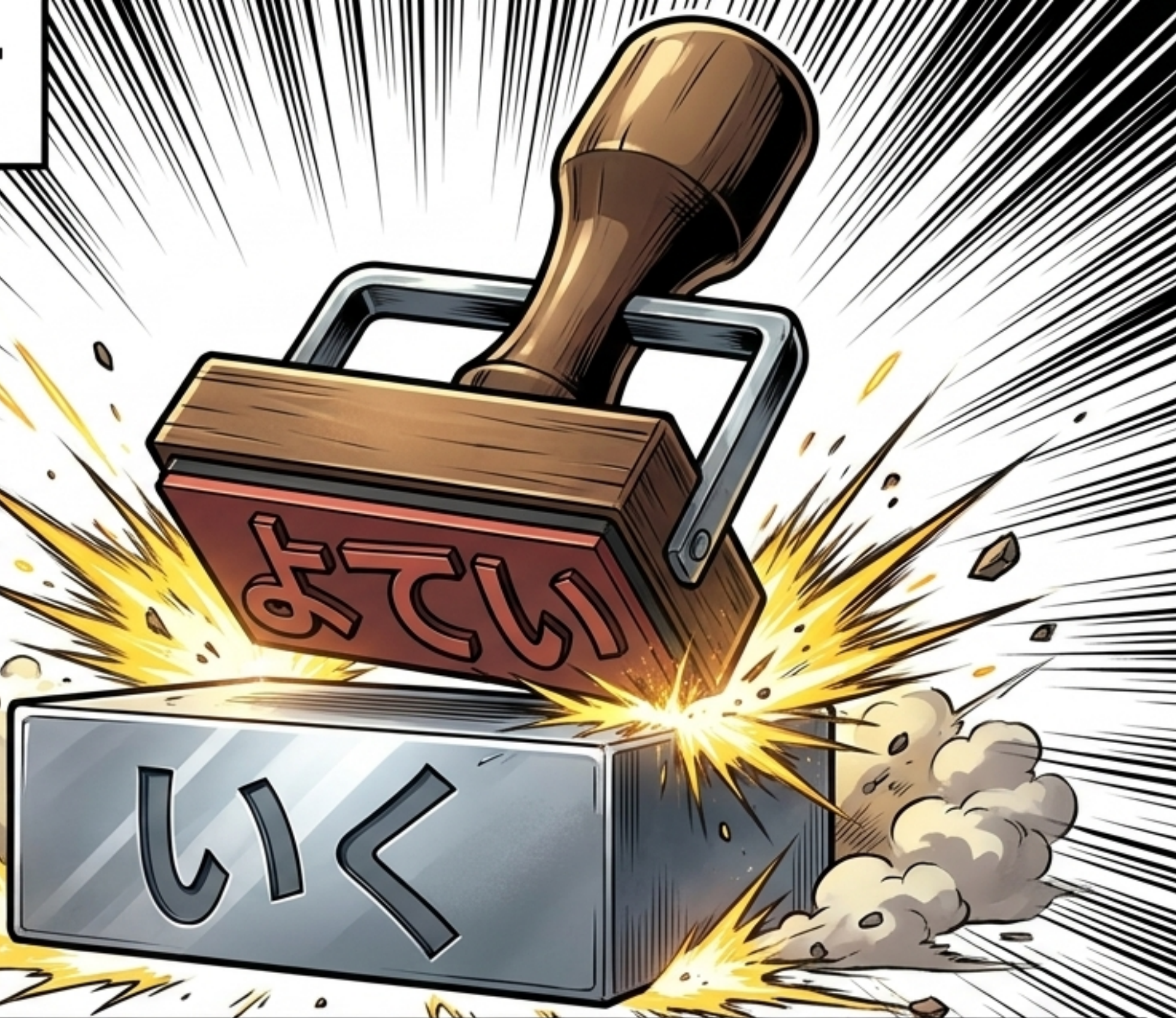
Yotei = On the

While 'Tsumori' is about your inner intention, 'Yotei desu' is used for things that are already decided as a schedule. If it's written in your planner or it's a company arrangement, 'Yotei' is the word you need!

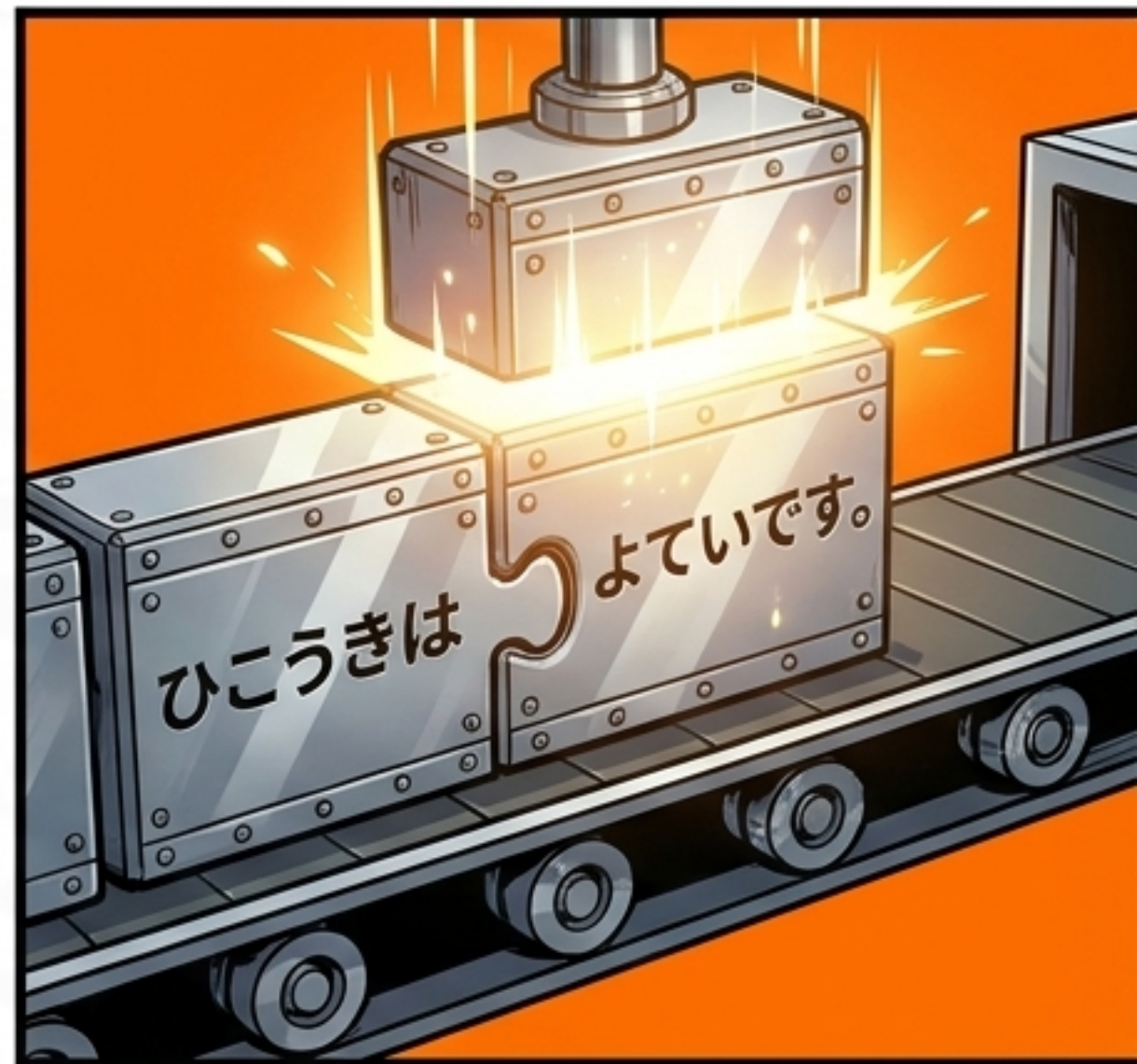
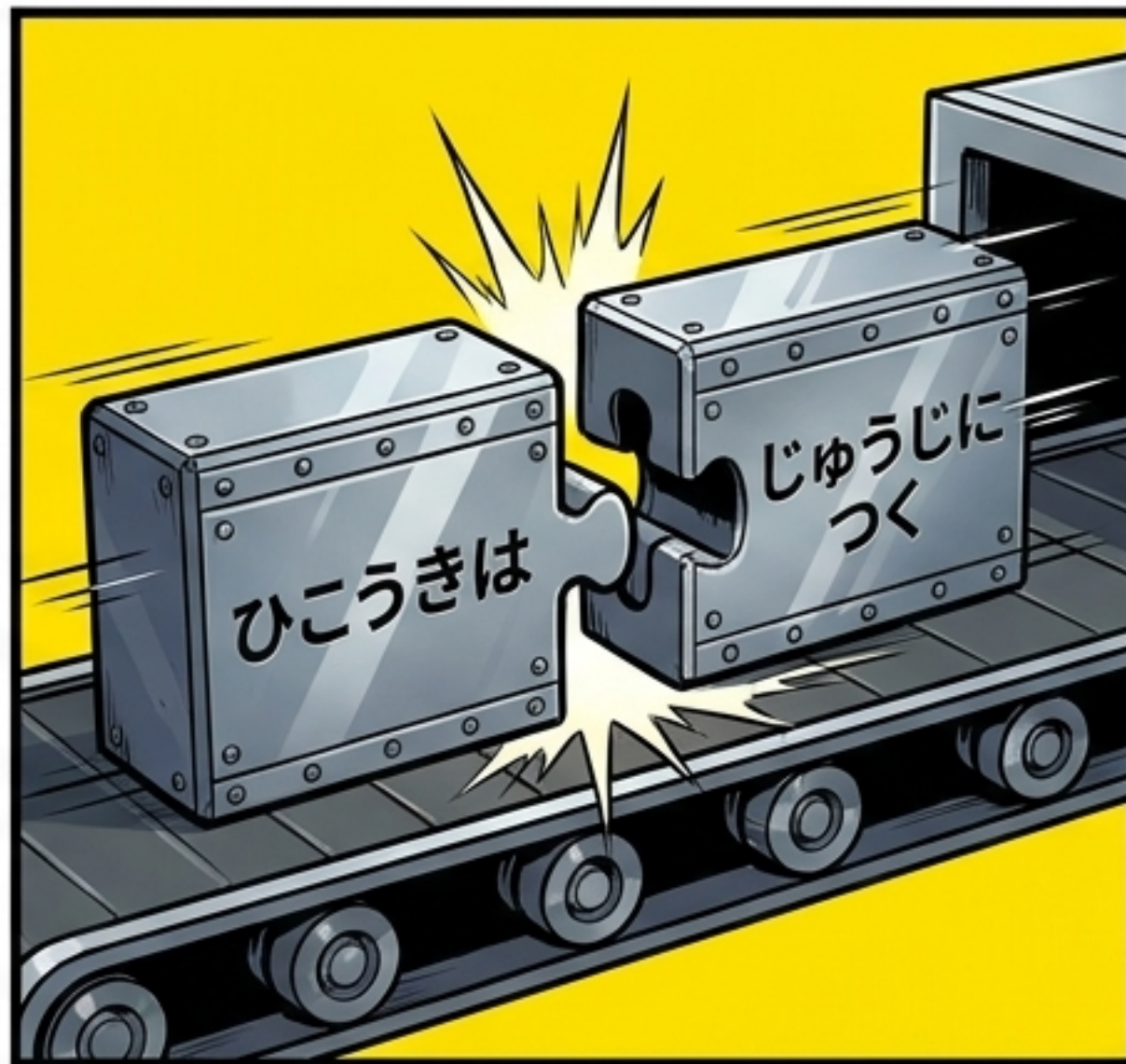
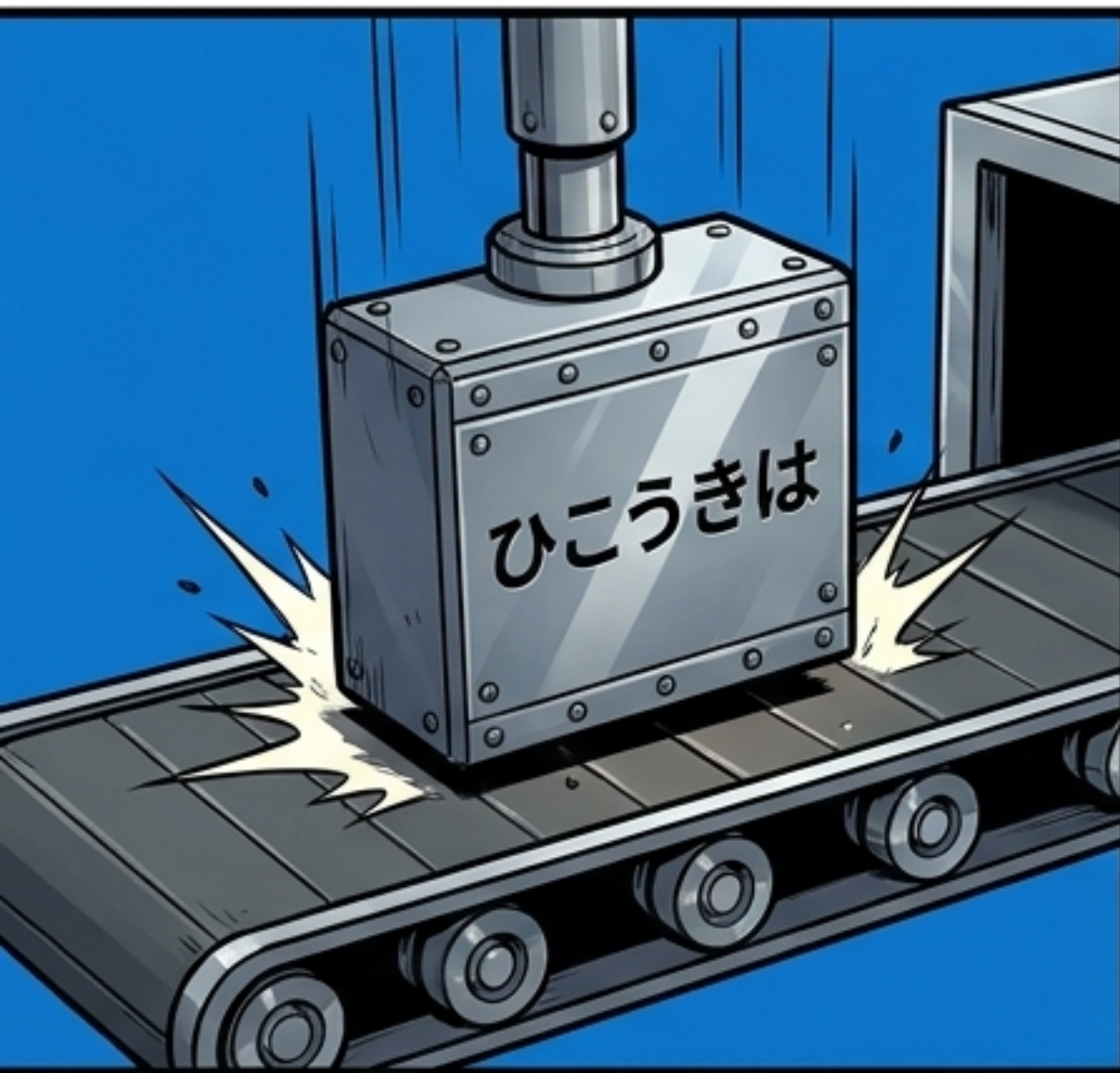
Dict Form + よていです

Lock it in! Just stamp
"Yotei desu" directly onto
the Dictionary Form!



The conjugation is easy! Just take the Dictionary form of the verb and add 'Yotei desu'. You can also use it with nouns by adding 'no': 'Kaigi no yotei desu' (Scheduled for a meeting).

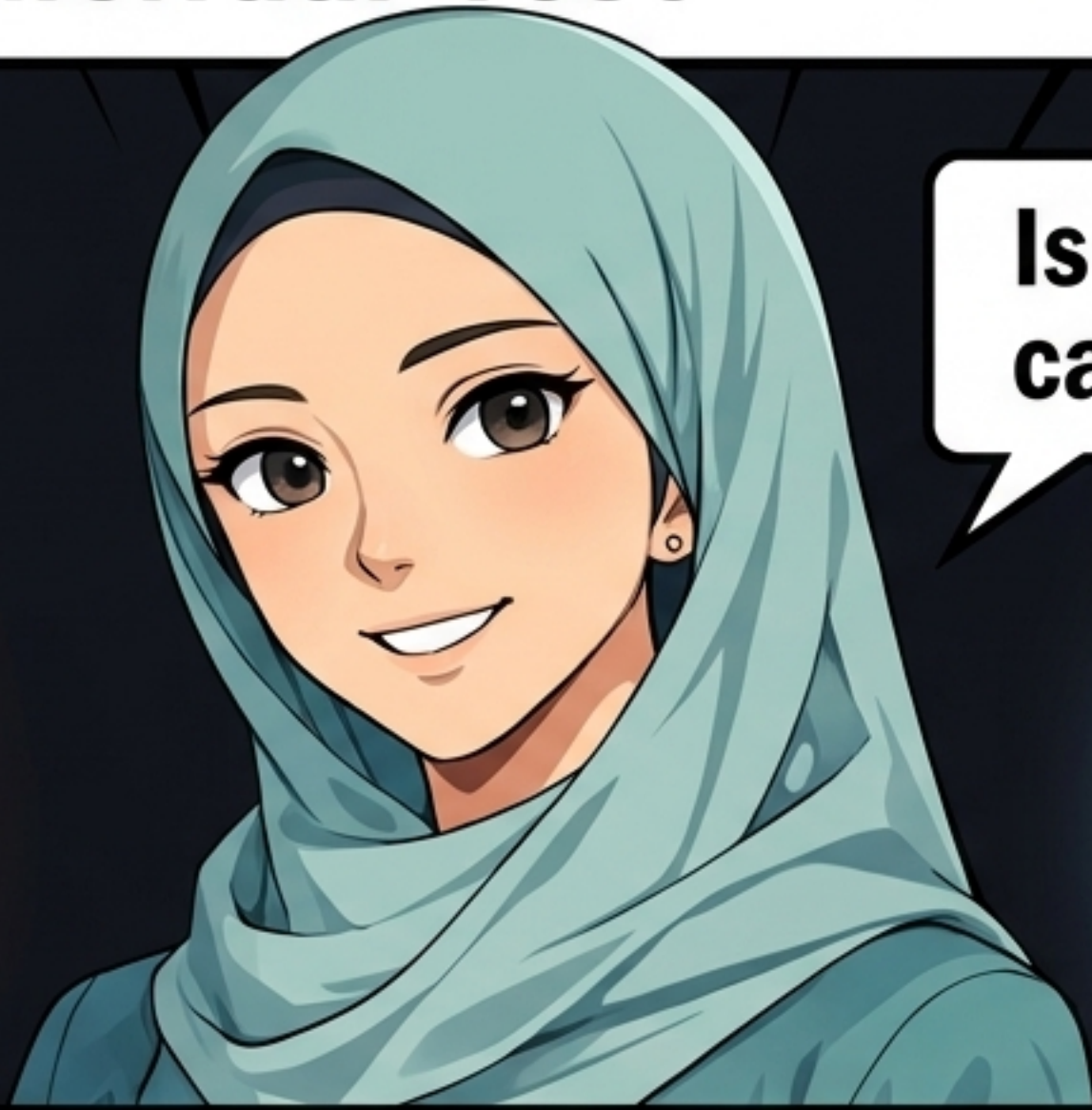
The Assembly Line

Is it in your calendar?



Tsumori (Personal) vs. Yotei (Official)

Here is the easiest way to choose! If you just think you'll do it, use 'Tsumori'. If the time and place are already decided or other people are involved (like a business trip or a wedding), use 'Yotei'. It sounds much more certain and professional!

✅ Use 'Tsumori' or Plain Verb

Joy, unless you are a world-famous athlete with a strict team-managed schedule, waking up is a personal intention! For private habits or simple choices, stick to 'Tsumori' or just the plain verb. 'Yotei' is for 'Official' things!

The "Yotei" Cheat Sheet



Structure: [Verb Dict Form] + よていです。

Meaning: Scheduled to / Plan to (Official).

Noun Version: [Noun] + の + よていです。

Vibe: Certain, external, and objective.
