The Appointment Shortcut: Scheduled for [Noun]



かいぎに
よていです。

(I am scheduled to
attend a meeting).



あしたは
かいぎの
よていです。

(Tomorrow is scheduled
for a meeting).



Using Nouns to State Plans. When the event itself is a noun (meeting, trip, exam), skip the verb and attach it directly!

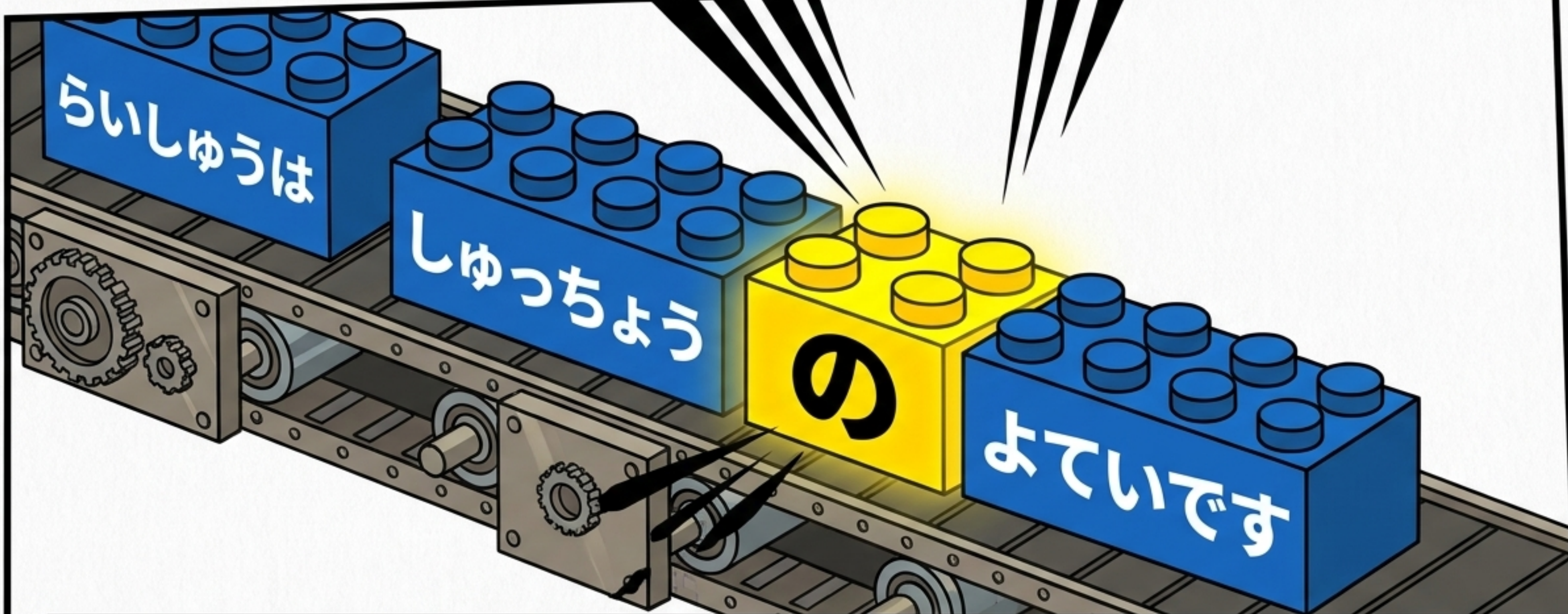
LIVING (Verbs)



NON-LIVING (Nouns)



Because a noun is a 'static rock,' it cannot move on its own. It requires the 'NO' connector glue to stick to the word Yotei.



**らいしゅうは しゅっちょうの よていです。
(Next week is scheduled for a business trip.)**

Raya's Hack

***Does it have a
heartbeat?***



Perfect for Work! If the word is a static event (like a meeting or a holiday), it has no heartbeat. You MUST use the [の] glue!

Don't do this!

あした、しけん
よていです!



✗ Skipping the 'NO'. You can't smash two nouns together! Without the glue, it sounds like broken caveman Japanese.



Structure: [Noun] + の + よていです。

Use for: Official events, meetings, and business plans.

Pro Tip: Use it when the "event" is more important than the "action".

Example: つぎの かいぎは らいしゅうの よていです。
(The next meeting is scheduled for next week.)
