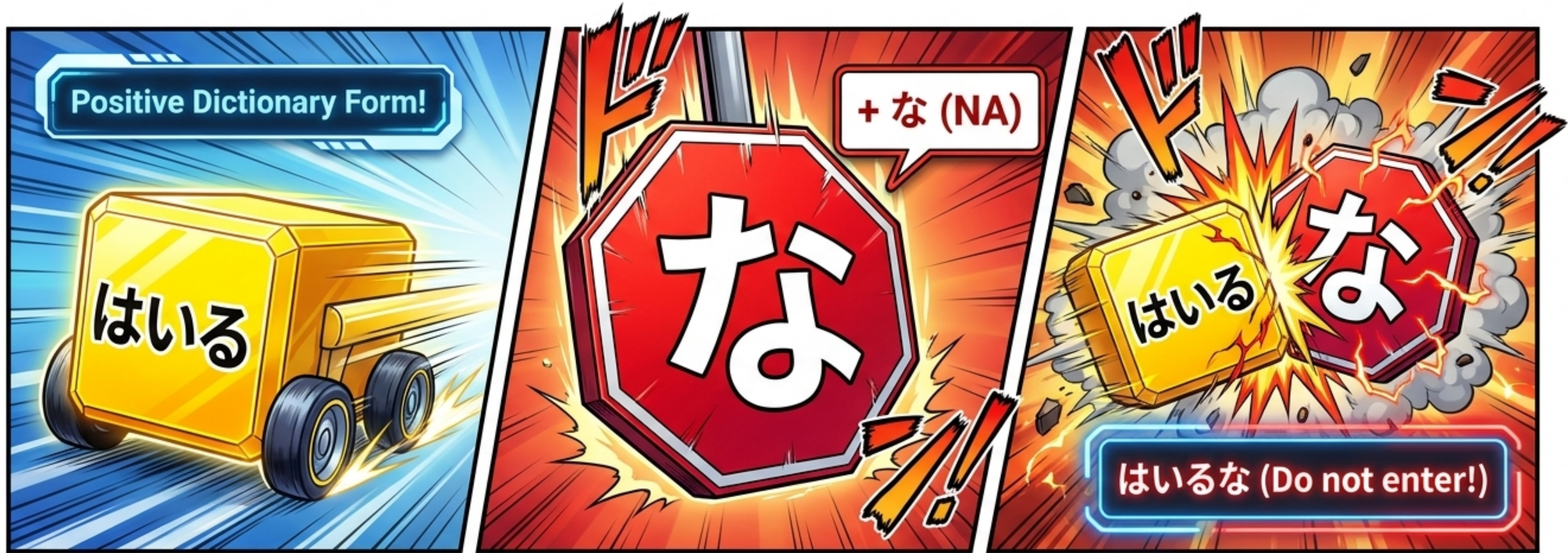
The Ultimate Warning:

# THE CONCEPT: 0% POLITE. 100% DIRECT.



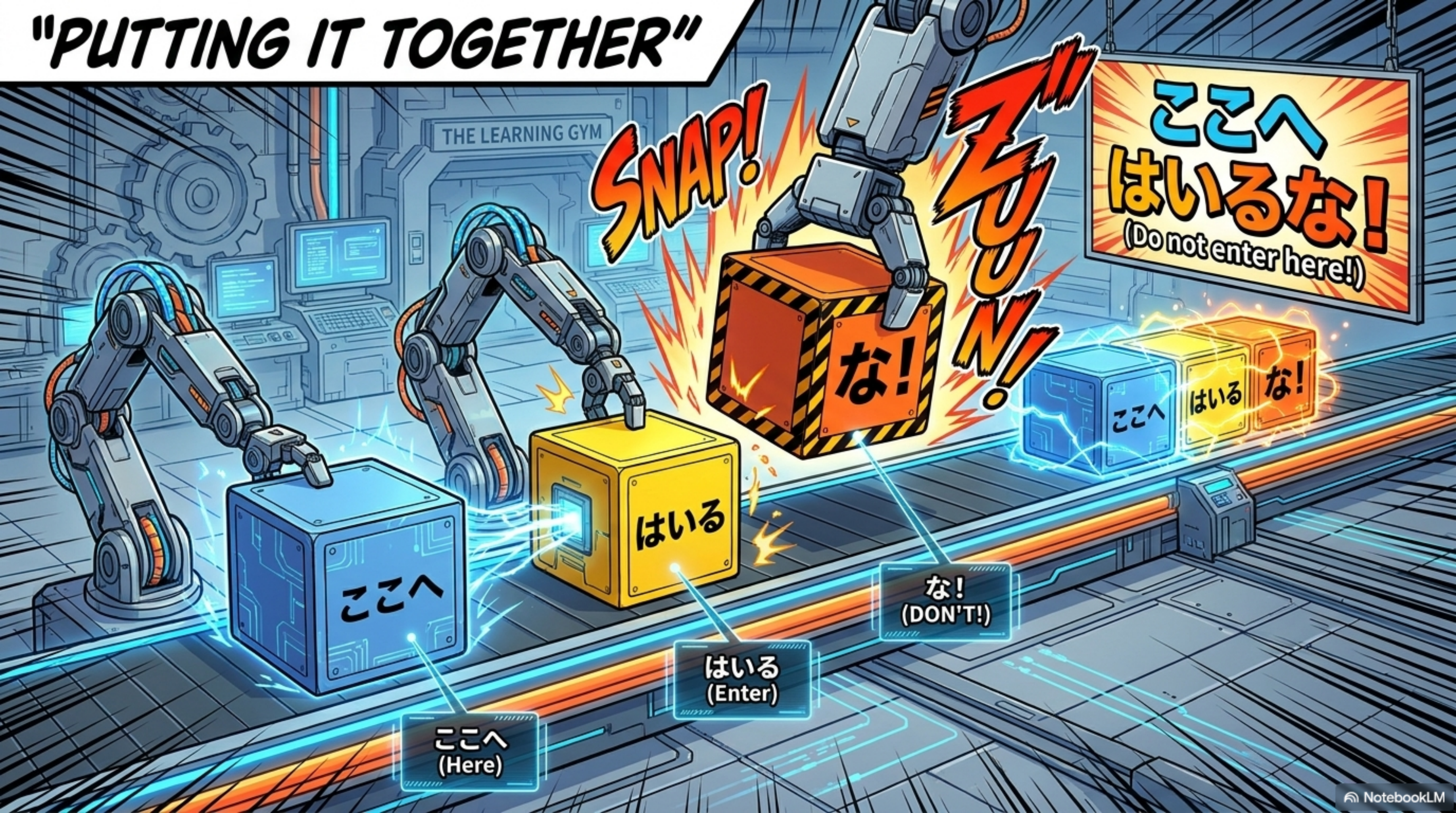
The prohibitive form is a direct, harsh command. Use it for dangerous mistakes or strict warning signs!

# The NA Stop Sign



**Raya's Voice:** Don't overthink it! Slap 'NA' onto the standard, positive Dictionary form. That's it!

# DON'T DO THIS! (The #1 Mistake)

「たべないな！」

(Tabenai-na!)

NO!

Never  
use the  
Nai-form!

Because it means 'don't', students accidentally use the negative Nai-form.  
**WRONG!** It must be the **Positive Dictionary Form + na (Taberu-na)!**

# Mission Summary

Structure: [Verb Dictionary Form] + な

Meaning: Don't do X! (Very strong negative command).

Golden Rule: NEVER attach な to the negative Nai-form.

Common Uses: Emergencies, strict signs, and sports cheering.
