I **will** do.”

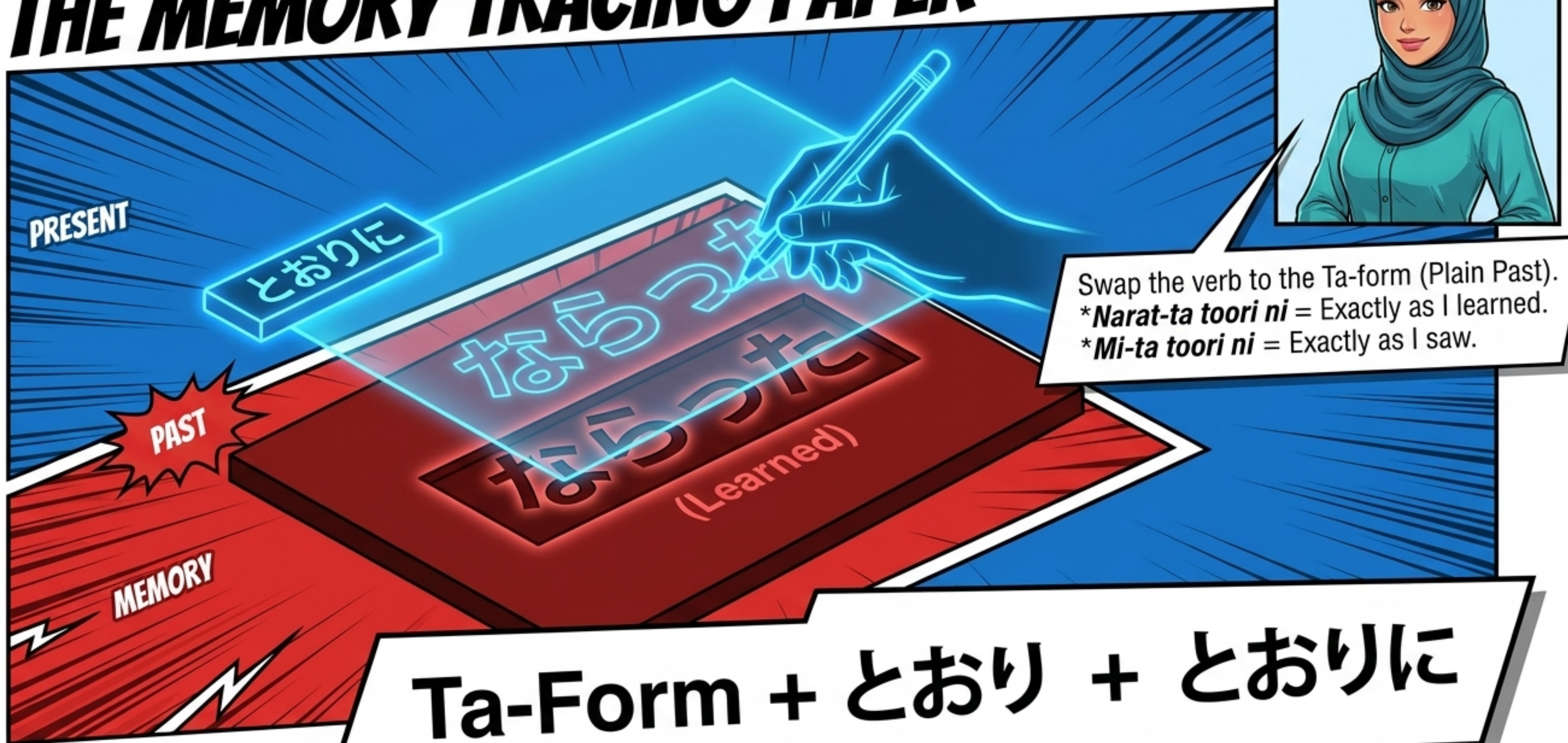
[Ta-Form]
“Do exactly as
I **did**.”

Want someone to copy
what you just did? Use
the past tense Ta-form!

Past Replay

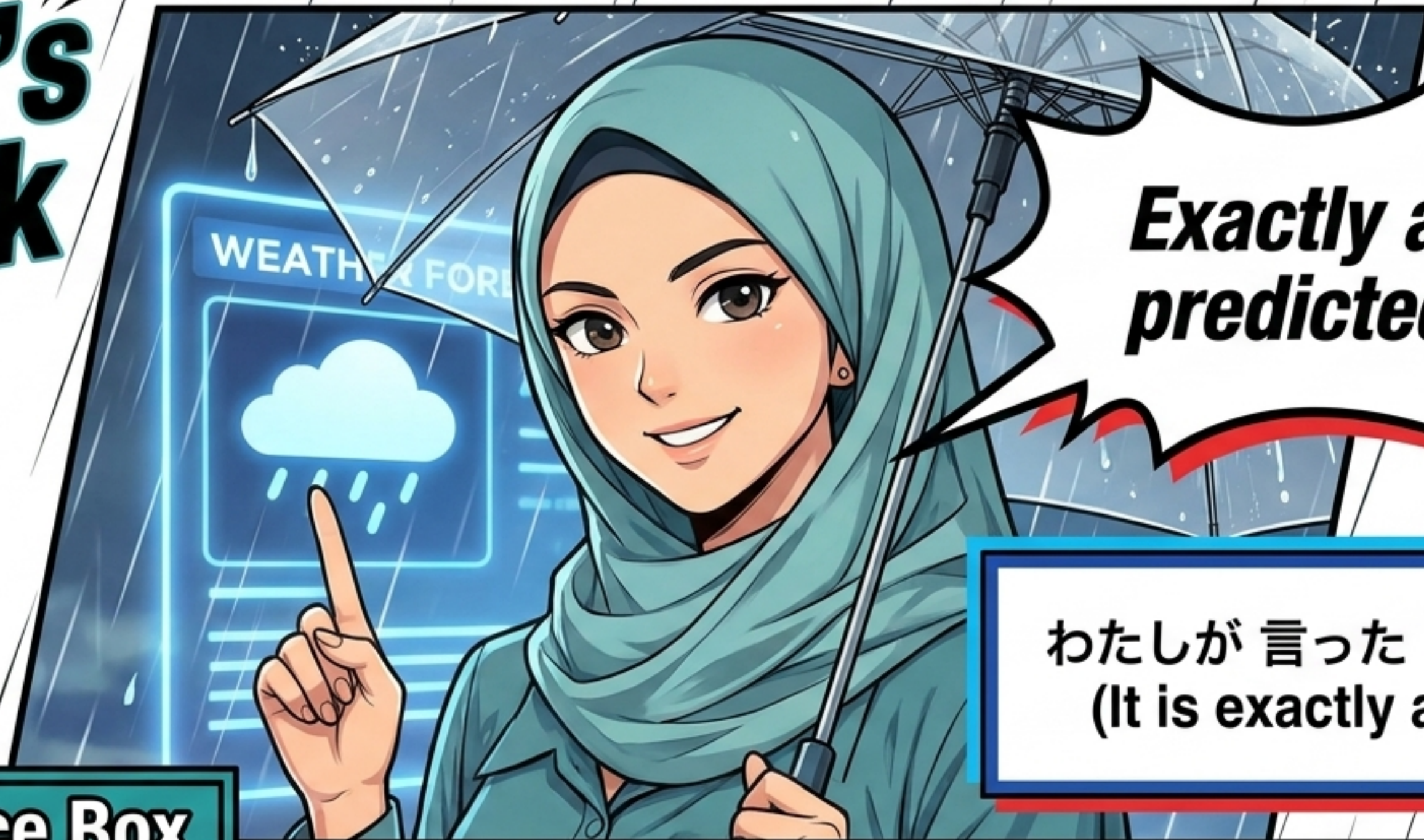

Advice Box

***Perfect for "I told you so!" moments.
The reality perfectly copied your past words!***

Watch your timeline! You can't use the present/future dictionary form (miru) with a past word like 'yesterday' (kino).



きのう みた とおりに
(Exactly as I saw yesterday).

Ta-Form “Replay” Cheat Sheet

Structure: [Verb Ta-form] + とおりに

Meaning: Exactly as I/they did (in the past).

Use for: Replicating past actions, instructions previously given, or confirming predictions.

Most common verbs:

- 言った (Said)
- 見た (Saw)
- 習った (Learned)
- やった (Did)
