Describing Action Friendliness

「たべにくいです。」
(Hard to eat).



「たべやすいです。」
(Easy to eat).



When a tool, book, food, or process makes an action easy, comfortable, or smooth to perform, you attach *yasui desu* directly to the verb stem!



Verb ます-stem + やすいです

ます

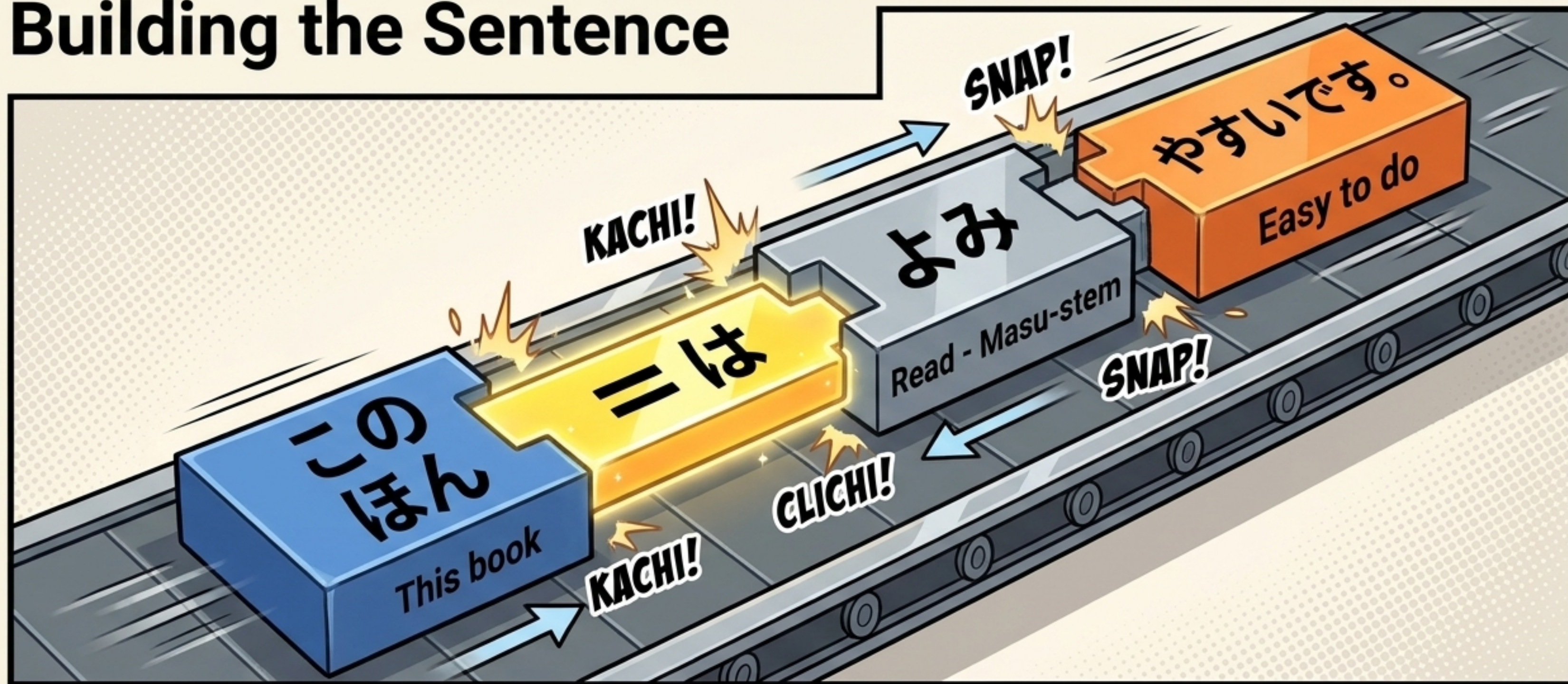
やすいです

The rule is simple!
Take your polite verb form,
chop off masu, and attach
yasui desu to the stem.

- Tsukaimasu → Tsukai-yasui desu (Easy to use).
- Yomimasu → Yomi-yasui desu (Easy to read).

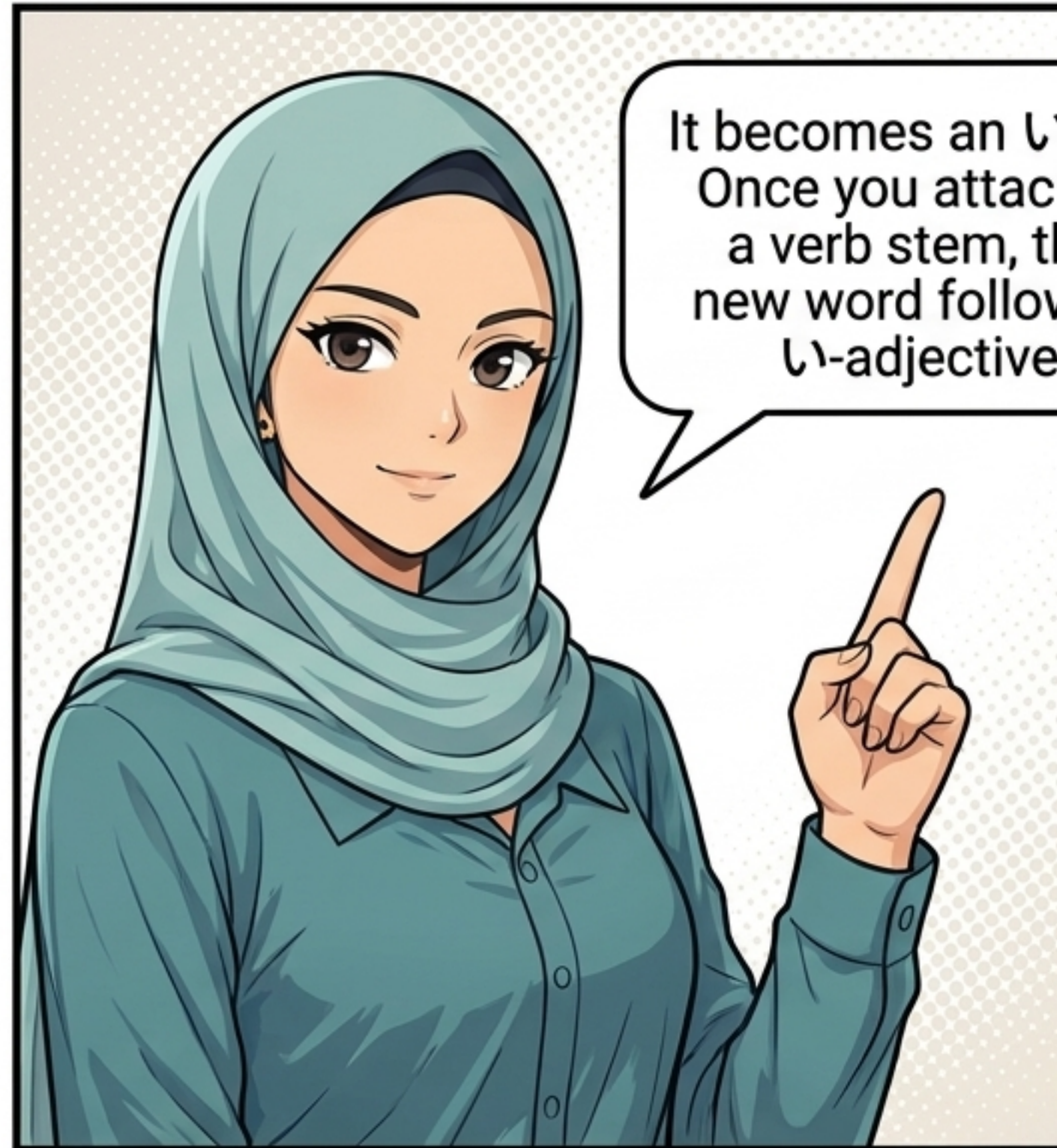


Assembly Line: Building the Sentence



このほんは読みやすいです。(This book is easy to read.)

Raya's Hack: The Adjective Morph



It becomes an い-adjective!
Once you attach **yasui** to
a verb stem, the entire
new word follows regular
い-adjective rules.

やすい

Formula	Verb stem + やすい → い-adjective Rules
Present	Tsukai-yasui desu (Easy to use)
Past	Tsukai-yasukatta desu (Was easy to use)
Modifying Noun	Tsukai-yasui sumaho (An easy-to-use smartphone)

Don't do this! (Action Scene)



✗ Keeping the “ます” (masu) attached.

Joy, don't leave the masu attached! You **MUST** chop off masu completely before adding **yasui desu**:

○ この スマホは つかい やすい です (This smartphone is easy to use).

Structure: Verb (ます-stem) + やすいです。

Meaning: Easy to do [Verb].

Grammar behavior: Functions strictly as an い-adjective (yasui, yasukatta).

Core Examples:

- つかいやすい (Easy to use)
- よみやすい (Easy to read)
- わかりやすい (Easy to understand)
